**Tourism Promotion** has become our special project during these uncertain times. Tourism is the world's largest industry. Prior to the pandemic, according to the National Travel and Tourism Week (NTTW) the travel industry was a powerful economic engine, supporting jobs and driving local economies in every pocket of America. The industry had experienced 107 straight months of growth, generated \$2.6 trillion in economic output, supported 17 million American jobs and delivered a \$51 billion trade surplus to the U.S.

Economic output fell by 2.5% in Georgia in 2020, a smaller contraction than in most states. The smaller than average economic decline during the COVID-19 pandemic in the state was due in part to strong performances in the utilities and finance, insurance, and real estate sectors, which each had a net positive impact on economic growth in the state.

While Tourism bounced back strongly in 2022, driven by pent-up demand and the lifting of travel restrictions, the

international travel remains 54.6% below pre-pandemic. The recovery is fragile with new uncertainties from the economic slowdown & geopolitical instability.

The Multicultural Communities within Georgia and throughout the world have always been instrumental in increasing Tourism Revenues for Georgia, for employment and our economic growth. Let's work together to help each other.
