Tourism Promotion has become our special project during these uncertain times. Tourism is the world's largest industry. Prior to the pandemic, according to the National Travel and Tourism Week (NTTW) the travel industry was a powerful economic engine, supporting jobs and driving local economies in every pocket of America. The industry had experienced 107 straight months of growth, generated \$2.6 trillion in economic output, supported 17 million American jobs and delivered a \$51 billion trade surplus to the U.S.

During 2019, 53.2 million visitors spent \$18.9 billion in Louisiana. 242,200 Louisianans are employed in the travel and hospitality industry. The negative impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on the travel and tourism industry in Louisiana were devastating, but it is recovering gradually.

While Tourism bounced back strongly in 2022, driven by pent-up demand and the lifting of travel restrictions, the international travel remains 54.6% below pre-pandemic. The recovery is fragile with new uncertainties from the economic slowdown & geopolitical instability.

The Multicultural Communities within Louisiana and throughout the world have always been instrumental in increasing Tourism Revenues for Louisiana, for employment and our economic growth. Let's work together to help each other.
