Tourism Promotion has become our special project during these uncertain times. Tourism is the world's largest industry. Prior to the pandemic, according to the National Travel and Tourism Week (NTTW) the travel industry was a powerful economic engine, supporting jobs and driving local economies in every pocket of America. The industry had experienced 107 straight months of growth, generated \$2.6 trillion in economic output, supported 17 million American jobs and delivered a \$51 billion trade surplus to the U.S.

Missouri Tourism suffered greatly from COVID-19, dropping from 42.9 million visitors in 2019 to 33 million in 2021 and total spending from \$17.7 billion in 2019 to \$13.5 billion in 2021. The employment dropped from 304,329 to 257,057.

While Tourism bounced back strongly in 2022, driven by pent-up demand and the lifting of travel restrictions, the international travel remains 54.6% below pre-pandemic. The recovery is fragile with new uncertainties from the economic slowdown & geopolitical instability.

The Multicultural Communities within Missouri and throughout the world have always been instrumental in increasing Tourism Revenues for Missouri, for employment and our economic growth. Let's work together to help each other.
