Tourism Promotion has become our special project during these uncertain times. Tourism is the world's largest industry. Prior to the pandemic, according to the National Travel and Tourism Week (NTTW) the travel industry was a powerful economic engine, supporting jobs and driving local economies in every pocket of America. The industry had experienced 107 straight months of growth, generated \$2.6 trillion in economic output, supported 17 million American jobs and delivered a \$51 billion trade surplus to the U.S. including US Territories.

While tourism revenue suffered immensely during the pandemic, the US Territories bounced back strongly in 2022, driven by pent-up demand and the lifting of travel restrictions. More than 5.1 million passengers arrived at the Luis Muñoz Marín International Airport of **Puerto Rico**, a 6.5% increase from 2021. Approximately \$8.9 billion in revenue was generated by travel and tourism, a 39% increase over the previous high in 2019. The Island now employs more than 91,500 individuals in travel and tourism related jobs, also the highest ever. Employment in the leisure and hospitality sector in Puerto Rico has increased by 12.8% compared to pre-pandemic levels, while employment numbers in the U.S. remain 4% below when considering the same period.

In 2020, the **Virgin Islands** generated **around 686.00 million US dollars** in the tourism sector alone. This corresponds to 16.32 percent of its the gross domestic product and approximately 9 percent of all international tourism receipts in the Caribbean.

A 2020 report from the **Guam Visitors Bureau** revealed that the tourism industry directly and indirectly accounts for 60% of Guam's total revenues, making it the "primary driver of Guam's economy," employing about 21,000 or 33% of Guam's civilian workforce.

The 14 volcanic islands of the **Northern Mariana archipelago**, located in the northwestern Pacific Ocean aren't easy to get to because of distance (average 32 hours) and limited flights. The most visited and largest islands in the archipelago are Saipan, Tinian and Rota. Tourists flock to the stunning beaches and the natural beauty of Mount Tapochau, Banzai Cliff, and many historical sights. The economy is however improving after a significant decline in tourism in 2019, 2020 and 2021.

Tourism to **American Samoa** suffered drastically, from more than 20,000 visitors in 2018 to just 900 visitors in 2020, with total tourism revenues of \$23 million.
